We add -er to adjectives with 1 syllable:
e.g. cheap, cheaper; big, bigger;
or adjectives with 2 syllables when they end in -y:
e.g. easy, easier; happy, happier.
We use the word than after a comparative.

*Water is cheaper than milk.
Brussels is a smaller city than Berlin.*
